WHEREAS: our water system in Fayetteville serves over 82,000 people who

utilize an average of 200 gallons of water per person, per day,

and

WHEREAS: changes in weather patterns are causing epic drought and

widespread flooding in regions throughout the United States, putting pressure on water systems that are ill-equipped and ill-

prepared to manage such extreme events, and

WHEREAS: utilities nationwide are grappling with aging infrastructure and

lack of reliable revenue and funding to maintain, let alone

upgrade, their systems, and

WHEREAS: one-fifth of the U.S. economy would grind to a halt without a

reliable and clean source of water, and

WHEREAS: managing water responsibly is critical to our nation's

environmental health, and investing in our drinking water and wastewater systems will secure a bright and prosperous future

for generations to come, and

WHEREAS: for every one job created in the water sector, another 3.68 jobs

are added in the national economy and for every \$1 spent on infrastructure improvements, the U.S. generates \$6 in returns,

and

WHEREAS: every region faces different water challenges so the solutions to

strengthen our drinking water and wastewater systems must be locally driven, however reinvestment in our water must be a

national priority, and

WHEREAS: the City of Fayetteville is dedicated to investing in water and

wastewater infrastructure but will need help and funding from

our federal partners,

NOW THEREFORE, I, Lioneld Jordan, Mayor of the City of Fayetteville, Arkansas do hereby proclaim September 15, 2016 as

"IMAGINE A DAY WITHOUT WATER"

in Fayetteville, Arkansas and encourage all citizens to recognize that water is essential to the quality of life and economic competitiveness of our City.
